This Is The Way It Was

This monthly photo column by Ken Murdock features railroad scenes of the past, a look back into railroading's history.



Most of our members never knew that our former NRHS Chapter once owned an RDC car. Many of our long-time members have probably forgotten that it once, very briefly, passed thru our hands. This is it stored at Auto-Train's shops in August 1980, before it became our property. I don't recall why Auto-Train had it or what they planned to do with it, but it sat around in Sanford for several years. – Ken Murdock photo



Later it was determined that it had a broken center-sill and was declared "not repairable". Dick Perkins found out about it and managed to get it donated to our organization. Another little know item, that we once owned briefly, was Florida East Coast Railway shop crane MC463. It was donated by the FEC in the early 1980s and was stored at Dick Perkins' home in Oviedo. It was electric and self-propelled. Dick became aware that the Gold Coast RR Museum could use it, so we traded it for the Fairmont motor car that we now have on display in the museum. August Museum Report

We had our first Wednesday workday on August 2, with Phil Cross, Jerry and Ginger Honetor and I participating. Jerry continued his inventory work in the library while Ginger continued her work with displays plus adding items to the gift shop and hosting in the afternoon. Phil worked on rearranging many items that had been ignored for a long time, adding some to our files and getting others to Ginger to be cleaned and sold in the gift shop. I finished installing wood studs in the new meeting room. The mechanical contractor finished installing ductwork for the new meeting room and the electricians came in for several hours and finished most of their rough-in for the wall outlets. When the electricians finish installing the light fixtures, we will be ready for the rough-in inspection of the new meeting room.

On Wednesday workday on August 9, we had Phil Cross, Jerry & Ginger Honetor, Irv Lipscomb and I participating. Phil did a lot of cleaning up and organizing, Jerry worked in the new library on inventory, Ginger took care of the collection and hosted in the afternoon, Irv continued with inventory in the flat files and I worked on the remaining rough carpentry items. The electricians got about half of the new light fixtures installed in the new meeting room.

The next Wednesday workday was on August 16. Those participating included Jerry & Ginger Honetor, Irv Lipscomb and me. We all worked on the same items as last week except that I finished all the remaining rough carpentry items. After the electrician finishes and we get the next city inspection, the new meeting room will be ready for insulation in the exterior walls and then gypsum wallboard. Jerry and I ended the day by removing the attachments for the library shelving on the west wall. It is now ready to be moved it into the new work shop during our Saturday museum workday on the 19th.

Saturday, August 19th, was our monthly museum workday and those participating included Phil Cross, Jarrod Reynolds, Jerry & Ginger Honetor, Les Westlake, Joe Lehmann and me. Phil cleaned up around the outside and then he Ginger took care of the housekeeping chores. Jarrod, Les and I emptied temporary shelving in the new work shop and removed and disassembled them. We then brought the old library shelving from the west wall and installed them in the new work shop and loaded them, mostly with surplus Root items.

Joe advised us as to what will be needed to permanently connect our router in the Roper Building before installing gypsum wallboard on the walls. We also discussed the mounting height for the TV once it is relocated to the new meeting room. Jerry worked in the library and continued moving items from the old to the new library. Phil worked on the Flat Wheel and he and Jarrod moved the disassembled shelving outside for pickup by the city.

Our Wednesday workday on August 23 was very productive. Phil Cross, Irv Lipscomb, Jerry & Ginger Honetor and I participated. Jerry and Phil went to Lowes and purchased fiberglass wall insulation and gypsum wallboard for the new meeting room. It has been very nice having Jerry's truck for these runs to Lowes. While they were gone I worked on miscellaneous carpentry items and Irv worked on flat file inventory while Ginger worked on sprucing up the collection. When they returned with the materials, we all pitched in and unloaded the truck. After lunch Jerry, Phil and I installed all the insulation in the perimeter walls. Once inspected, we are ready to install the gypsum wallboard.

Due to my electric stapler not working on Wednesday, I fixed it at home and returned Saturday, August 26th, and stapled the insulation to the wood studs. This will allow us to have an insulation inspection first thing Wednesday, August 30th, and immediately begin installing the gypsum wallboard. 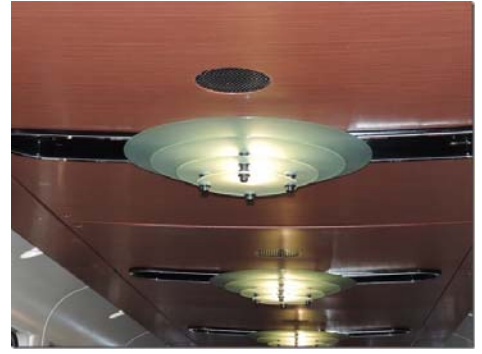

The ACL RR Longwood, Florida Depot

The Longwood, Florida depot was built early 1900's by the ACL RR. The depot served the community from the time of building to circa 1960. In the 1960s, the depot was moved to Hilliard and became part of the railroad museum called *Trains of Yesterday*. Sometime in the 1970s, the railroad museum was closed and depot was moved two blocks from former museum site and was converted to a family home.
