This monthly photo column by Ken Murdock features railroad scenes of the past, a look back into railroading's history.



Our NRHS chapter had a tour of Seaboard System's Piggyback Yard at Taft on May 19, 1984. The visit was arranged by society member Neil Aly who had the contract to maintain and repair railroad trailers and the Piggy Packer at the yard. While Manning was in the midst of his briefing, this yard tractor lost its trailer, making a very loud bang! This was somewhat embarrassing for Manning but not a big problem, however. This mammoth machine known as the Piggy Packer was used to load and unload trailers. This yard eventually had two of these machines to speed up the operation and to have a backup in case one was down for repairs. Prior to acquiring these machines, trailers were driven onto the flatcars with yard tractors with a hydraulic fifth wheel. With the advent of the Packers, spine cars were developed which provided floor decking only for the trailer wheels, thus reducing tare weight. – *Ken Murdock photo*

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High-Speed Rail Sets South Florida Debut

Fort Lauderdale — A higher-speed passenger train that is eventually expected to run from Miami to Orlando is set to launch operations in South Florida. Brightline officials told local news outlets that the initial service between Fort Lauderdale and West Palm Beach will begin the week of January 8th. The Miami station is schedule to come on board within three months. The parent company, All Aboard Florida, had planned to launch the \$3 billion project between Miami and West Palm Beach over the summer. But a variety of factors delayed the project.

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Mosaic to Close 430-Employee Plant City Fertilizer Plant at Year's End

PLANT CITY — Mosaic announced Tuesday it will close its Plant City fertilizer plant at the end of 2017 for at least a year to cut costs and improve profitability.

The plant, on State Road 39 just south of the Hillsborough-Pasco county line, has a work force of 430. The company said it is offering 200 voluntary retirement incentive packages to its Florida employees and has created about 100 more open positions through a hiring freeze over the last several months.

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"The hope is to place as many of those impacted employees as possible in open positions in the company's other facilities," Mosaic spokeswoman Jackie Barron said.

Mosaic has Florida operations in Hillsborough, Polk, Manatee and Hardee counties. Those not placed elsewhere will receive a severance package based on, among other things, their number of years with the company and pay.

The Plant City facility opened in 1965 and has the capacity to produce 2 million tons of fertilizer a year, the company said.

"Our business performed well in the third quarter, notwithstanding the impacts of Hurricane Irma on our phosphates operations," Mosaic president and chief executive officer Joc O'Rourke said on a conference call to announce the company's third-quarter earnings.

"We are making the move in Florida for several reasons," he said. "Plant City is the highest-cost facility amongst our Florida operations, and it requires a disproportionate amount of sustaining capital each year."

Idling the plant, he said, should help the company optimize capital investments and allow it to increase production at its most efficient Florida facilities to offset the tons produced at Plant City. And it also gives the company the option to re-open the Plant City plant if demand grows.

"While these decisions are difficult and have impacts on our employees, today's actions put Mosaic in a strong position to benefit as market dynamics improve," O'Rourke said.

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DOT Approves Brightline PAB

Brightline, the in-process South Florida private passenger service operator, announced the U.S. Department of Transportation approved a \$1.15 billion Private Activity Bond allocation, and that Brightline also secured the final two South Florida Water Management District permits needed to construct the planned high-speed segment between Orlando and Cocoa.

The company said it plans to start construction on the Phase 2 high-speed line in early 2018.

"In another major step forward for Brightline's Phase 2 extension to Orlando, U.S. DOT approved a \$1.15 billion Private Activity Bond allocation," said Dave Howard, Brightline's Chief Executive. "After a successful \$600 million PAB closing this week, we are pleased to have this financing option available. We appreciate the leadership of U.S. DOT as they work to move major infrastructure projects forward, creating thousands of jobs and stimulating hundreds of millions of dollars in economic development."

A Private Activity Bond allocation typically comprises tax-exempt bonds issued by or on behalf of local or state government for the purpose of providing special financing benefits for qualified projects. The financing is most often for projects of a private user, and the government generally does not pledge its credit.

Brightline said it is still analyzing all financing options for Phase 2, including a Railroad Rehabilitation and Improvement Financing loan. With all federal approvals in place, Brightline is finalizing the engineering and design for the rail infrastructure. Additionally, it is working on the installation of a new signal system and Positive Train Control (PTC) for the entire system between Miami and Orlando. PTC will be in place between Miami and West Palm Beach in 2018 and will be operational along the entire 235-mile route at the time the extension to Orlando opens.

Brightline's station in Orlando is planned for the Orlando International Airport's new Intermodal Terminal Facility that will be the hub of the future South Terminal complex.

The company said it continues working toward operational readiness with the Federal Railroad Administration for the launch of introductory service between West Palm Beach and Fort Lauderdale, and will release details soon.

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Feds Approve Brightline Express Train Extension Between South Florida and Orlando

Getting from South Florida to Orlando could be faster now that the federal government has approved the next phase of Brightline's high-speed passenger rail service that could begin construction early next year.

The leg between Fort Lauderdale and West Palm Beach was expected to open this year. With only a couple weeks left, ticket prices and a start date are coming "soon," company officials said.

The Federal Railroad Administration issued a decision Friday that essentially got the Miami-to-Orlando route back on track after Brightline's parent-company, All Aboard Florida, modified its plans.

"This is the most critical and final step in the extension of Brightline's service to Orlando, and we are excited to move forward," Brightline CEO Dave Howard said in a statement. "We look forward to launching service to Miami and starting construction north to Orlando in the first quarter of 2018."
